On 8 September 2022 Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II passed away at Balmoral Castle, Aberdeenshire, Scotland.

May She Rest in Peace

Her Majesty was Queen of the United Kingdom and other Commonwealth realms, including Australia, from 6 February 1952 until her death. She was Queen Regnant of 32 sovereign states during her lifetime and 15 at the time of her death and was the Head of the Commonwealth. Her reign of 70 years and 214 days is the longest of any British monarch and the longest recorded of any female head of state in history.

Particular import to us Sappers is that Her Majesty was also the Colonel-in-Chief of the Royal Australian Engineers.

It hasn't been announced who will replace Her Majesty as our Colonel-in-Chief. We are hopeful that this will be announced in the near future.

Changes will be required with our cap badge, service dress buttons and possibly our cipher. Our cap badge and service dress buttons include the letters ' $E_{11}R$ ' and our cap badge and cipher include what is often called 'The Queens Crown'. With His Majesty King Charles III now on the throne ' $E_{11}R$ ' will be replaced by ' $C_{111}R$ ' and depending on which crown His Majesty nominates the crown on our cap badge and cipher may also need to be changed, as will the crown that designates or is part of the designation of rank of some non-commissioned and commissioned officers.

President's Message

It is with much sadness that we mourn the recent passing of Queen Elizabeth II, our Monarch and the Colonel-in-Chief of the Royal Australian Engineers. We have been blessed to have served under Her Majesty and, on behalf of our membership, I extend our condolences to the Royal Family and the many people who have been affected by her passing.

This edition of the Newsletter honours the life of Queen Elizabeth II and outlines some symbolic changes we may see in the Corps in the future.

I hope you and yours have not been significantly affected by the recent floods in NSW. We should be cognisant of those so affected and the emergency services personnel (including RAE members) who have rendered such valuable assistance to flood victims and ongoing recovery tasks.

Although the Sappers' Autumn Slosh event in April was cancelled due to persistent rain, don't forget the Sappers Spring Slosh (SSS) is scheduled for Saturday/Sunday, 1/2 October 2022. I appreciate this is a long public holiday weekend, but the only weekend when 5 Engineer Regiment members do not have training and other commitments. I encourage members, particularly serving members, to attend this event SSS 2022 (refer attached flyer).

In previous Newsletters I have alluded to the fact that some of the existing Committee members are gradually approaching their "use by date". It is imperative that regional and younger members (that is, less than 70 years old) be prepared to nominate for positions or assistant positions on the Committee, at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) at 1400h on Saturday, 22 October 2022. This will help us to plan activities that cater for the interests of our younger and serving members, as well as ensuring the longevity of the Association. The responsibilities of the Committee members are not onerous, and business is now mostly conducted during relatively short quarterly teleconferences. The existing Committee members are more than happy to mentor younger members, who would find this contribution to other serving and ex-serving Sappers most satisfying and rewarding. I encourage our regional and younger members to nominate for positions on the Committee at the AGM. The AGM will be held at a physical meeting and by teleconference. Details of the AGM arrangements will be provided to members by email in early October 2022.

We have been liaising with the School of Military Engineering to combine our Annual Dinner with the touted School Ball on Saturday, 5 November 2022. Disappointingly, the anticipated SME Ball has translated into a cocktail function at the Museum of Contemporary Art, The Rocks, principally to farewell the outgoing Commanding Officer. Members have already been provided with details of the cocktail function. Your Committee, however, is planning a short notice, "down and dirty" much-delayed 47th Annual Sappers Dinner at the Holiday Inn, Warwick Farm, on Saturday, 12 November 2022. This will be much less formal than our usual dinners (there will be no Army band, no dancing and no presentations), but a great opportunity for Sappers and their guests to shake off the COVID lockdown blues and socialise over a buffet meal and in congenial company. The attached dinner flyer provides the relevant information. It is imperative that the RSVP date be adhered to, so we can confirm numbers and avoid any future financial penalty for the Association.

In our June 2022 Newsletter, I referred to a donation made to the Association by a former Committee member, John Ray, in memory of his late wife, Faye. You were also advised that the 1st Field Squadron Association was seeking funding for a memorial Bailey Bridge to be erected in Amiens, France, in recognition of the courageous service of Sappers on the Western Front during World War One. Following investigation of the Bailey Bridge project, the Committee has decided to defer making any donation until more information is provided by the organisers.

You may be aware that John Pritchard has, for a number of years, facilitated "Sappers Quarterly Luncheons" in the City (Sydney), usually at a pub or club. These lunches have proved to be a very successful way for Sappers to share short and tall stories during a meal, as well as discussing topical issues that affect the RAE Corps and Army. The Committee is keen to facilitate this kind of comradeship amongst members who reside outside the Sydney metropolitan area. Would any member who resides in the

Newcastle, Illawarra, Canberra or other regional area and is prepared to host or attend such quarterly gettogethers in their local area, please advise the Secretary so we can put locals in touch with each other. The lunches (or morning teas, or afternoon teas or dinners) could be held on the same days as the "Sappers Quarterly Luncheons", to provide a sense of common bonding of members in various parts of the State.

I hope to receive feedback and ideas from members and look forward to seeing you at future Sapper events.
