

It appears that the recommendation of the Defence Honours and Awards Appeals Tribunal for medallic and emblematic recognition for the families of seriously injured veterans has not been taken up by the Government. However the RAAF introduced a Remembrance Pin in 2006 and the RAN introduced theirs in 2007 for the families of their service people who died in service. The Army Remembrance Pin is a symbol for the families of Army Servicemen and women who have died while in service. The Army Remembrance Pin was introduced in 2015 and is a gift from the Chief of Army and demonstrates Army's deep appreciation of the members' and their families' contributions to the Australian Army.

Recent events at the Third Combat Engineer Regiment saw the North Queensland Sappers Shield for Outstanding Junior Officer awarded to LT Emily Ovenden, Combat Engineer, 18 Combat Engineer Squadron. Engineer bridge dedication and reception afterwards 11 November 2022



G'Day fellow Sappers,

Our (1 FD SQN RAE Assoc) bridge dedication in ANZAC Park, Toowong, Brisbane and the reception afterwards on 11 November 2022 went off really well. Even the weather was great. I have included a link to all the shots taken by our official photographer. Here is a quick-soldiers-five on the happening:

The reason for the dedication was to celebrate the 120th anniversary of the Corps of Royal Australian Engineers and to declare the name of the bridge which is: "The Bridge of Friendship between Australia and France: Dedicated to every Australian Army engineer unit involved in World War One".

The dedication included:

- * The Ambassador of France and his service personnel of whom two were dressed in traditional French uniforms.
- * General Stephen Day DSC AM who accepted, as a gift of friendship, the National Flag of France at the hand of French Navy Captain Jean-Marc Quilliet on behalf of His Excellency, The Ambassador of France, Monsieur Jean-Pierre Thebault.
- * Brigadier Michael Say DSC and his RSM WO1 Sean Chainey DSM OAM. Brigadier Say in his role as the Head of Corps of Royal Australian Engineers handed the Australian National Flag to the Ambassador of France as a gift of friendship between Australia and France.
- * Commanding Officer 2CER LTCOL Craig Bury and his RSM WO1 Benjamin King.
- * Officer Commanding 1st Field Squadron (1CER) Major Peter Witcomb.
- * The Master of Ceremonies was Major Andrew Coburn who spoke French to the French dignitaries during the ceremony.
- * RAE Banner Party of Lieutenant Alex Jackson, Sergeant Karl Booth and Sergeant Jesse Hall.
- * Chaplain of 2CER, Madre Cindy Waugh blessed the bridge and led the assembly in prayer.
- * Ribbon cutters were (from l to r): Mr Peter Gow representing the RSL, Cr James Mackay representing the Lord-Mayor of Brisbane, Captain Jean-Marc Quilliet, General Stpehen Day, Monsieur Jean-Pierre Thebault, Brigadier Michael Say, Mr Bart Mellish MP representing the Premier of Qld, and yours truly representing the 1st Field Squadron Association. The ribbon holders were Sapper Bailey Wagner and Corporal Daniel O'Sullivan, both of 1st Field Squadron, 1CER. The ribbon is held up by French and Australian service personnel. It states "Bridge of Friendship Pont de l'amitie 11 November 2022".

 *The band was from the Queensland Academy of Science, Mathematics and Technology and the choir from Chantefique de l'Alliance de Française de Brisbane.
- * At the reception a 95 year old French Foreign Legion veteran received his Legion of Honour from the French team.
- * We conducted a public valedictory for Colonel John Kemp's DSC which was approbated vigorously by the rest of us.
