AROUND THE TRAPS

You may have noticed our new Logo at the Masthead? Our first logo Super Sapper, has served us well for the past 20 or so years and thanks go to the Commanding Officer of the School of Military Engineering for allowing us the use of Lex Van Blyenburg's art work. But with the Incorporation of the NQ Branch it was time for an update; the final design selected ties past, present and future sappers together and also acknowledges our ties to the Third Combat Engineer Regiment (3CER). The background is the RAE Corps Flag surrounded by a purple belt, the colour of the distinguishing colour patches of RAE units of both the First and Second Australian Imperial Force's and current RAE units. The crossed pick and shovel is an engineer/mining symbol used since antiquity and carried by the Branch on ceremonial occasions. The dingo paw print on the lower background acknowledges our relationship with 3CER. And of course our working title on the belt.

It appears that sappers do rise to exalted places. Did you know that Cpl/Lt Ninian Martin Stephen (later Sir Ninian Stephen, High Court Chief Justice and Governor General 1982- 1989) and Captain Nigel Hubert Bowen (later Sir Nigel Bowen, Cabinet Minister and Federal Court Chief Justice) both served with 43 Australian Landing Craft Coy along with Lt Frank Packer, later Sir Frank Packer. The company served in New Guinea waters for a period of 19 months and was the sole means of transportation between Aitape and But to Wewak.

It seems that with DVA having the sole say on the official training and qualifications of Compensation and Wellbeing Advocates, the prior learning and experiences of current advocates are not accepted as an exemption from the new DVA Advocacy Training and Development Program (ATDP) qualification courses. So it would seem that the present advocates with their hard won experiences and knowledge are being discarded unless they qualify on the course. The shooting of a DVA foot comes to mind, not at all helped by DVA's On-Line Claims submission system that by all reports leaves a great deal to be desired, reportedly even encouraging incomplete and frivolous claims. So anyone looking for assistance with a claims submission may need to ensure that their chosen advocate is ATDP qualified if they don't want to affect the DVA Building Excellence in Support and Training program payments to their Ex Service Organisation. The words of wisdom from our advocate is to always talk to an advocate, before doing anything with, or going anywhere near DVA. Good advice.

Still on the subject of DVA comes a warning from the Vietnam Veterans Federation of Australia's April magazine that an organisation in Queensland is charging returned and ex-service personnel for advice and assistance with the submission of their claims to DVA. Charges include a six page contract that requires the veteran to pay fees for service such as \$1,000.00 plus GST to submit a Freedom of Information request; a cost to the client of four pension payments for a pension increase; payment for the initial client interview; lump sum payments at 5% plus GST a 10% fee for late payments. The organisation is also not required to hold any formal qualifications for advising veterans.

The bottom line is that there are organisations in the ESO community who will look after people dealing with DVA without having to go anywhere near these type of organisations.

And talking about advocates, one Jye Christie has put his hand up to be the DVA advocate for the NQ Sappers. Jai does his thing at the Thuringowa Branch of the RSL and can be contacted on 0425 337 7890. The Waterloo Dinner at 3CER was attended by three of our stalwarts who aren't averse to a good dining in night. AROUND AND ABOUT...Do You Remember FRED?



Back in 2006 when the Army Newspaper reported on the demise of FRED, they told of old soldiers and their younger colleagues being teary-eyed at the demise of a trusty old friend known as Fred, a comrade since the days long before Viet-Nam. Fred is the army-issue tin opener, bottle opener, spoon and screw driver; a shiny all in one implement manufactured in the gazillions and included in every one man ration pack issued to Australian soldiers since forever.

But in an age of ring-pull cans and heat-in-the-bag main meals, the Fred is no longer needed and his retirement prompted an outpouring of sorrow in recent letters to the Army Newspaper. "From opening tin cans to cleaning fingernails or personal assault weapons to a makeshift screwdriver, the humble Fred has served well," wrote Captain Brian Touhy of the Townsville based 3 Brigade. "It has never been decorated, Mentioned in Dispatches or given a Commanding Officer's Commendation. It has

gone about its business serving the Australian soldier, sailor and airman in every conceivable country and operation in the world without the recognition it so rightly deserves."

Major Justin Bayley, a defence logistics manager and senior food inspector advised that the Fred was being dropped so funds could be diverted to new and better items. And Lt-Col Sean Ryan advised that it said it wasn't just a money issue rather the fact that the Fred is redundant in the modem ration pack and modern technology has meant that the army can take advantage of more innovative packaging solutions such as ring-pulls to give the soldier in the field greater culinary delights and simpler preparation.

Not all soldiers were convinced. Major K.T Cook, of Bandiana said he was moved to solemnly inter his Fred in his backyard. "A few words were said and tears glistened in my eyes as Fred had been my faithful companion for more than 30 years," he said, querying whether a ring-pull could ever serve as a screw driver, for fingernail cleaning or for scraping the mud off boots. Similarly, Private Raymond Khoo of the Defence Languages School said his Fred had always been an important tool in the field. "It was used widely. Including the opening of tins to importantly the cleaning of weapons and other things limited only by one's imagination," he said.

And for those who haven't worked it out Fred stands for "flaming ridiculous eating device."

Since this snippet appeared back in 2006 Fred was apparently reissued for it seems that the users of the can spanner had a different view to those at boffin HQ. And now of course the one day ration pack reportedly comes in a multitude of varieties for a plethora of preferences including halal, meat free, pork free, vegetarian and vegan.
