Welcome to this edition of your Newsletter. Spring has sprung!

Our **Annual General Meeting** (AGM) will be held at 1400h on Saturday, 14 October 2023 (the AGM date was set before the Voice referendum date was announced). In previous Newsletters I have alluded to the fact that some of the existing Committee members are gradually approaching their "use by date". It is imperative that regional and younger members (that is, less than 70 years old) be prepared to nominate for positions or assistant positions on the all-ranks Committee. This will help us to plan activities that cater for the interests of our younger and serving members, as well as ensuring the longevity of the Association. The responsibilities of the Committee members are not onerous, and business is now mostly conducted during relatively short quarterly teleconferences. The existing Committee members are more than happy to mentor younger members, who would find this contribution to other serving and ex-serving Sappers most satisfying and rewarding. I encourage our regional and younger members to nominate for positions on the Committee at the AGM. The AGM will be held by teleconference. Details of the AGM arrangements will be emailed to members by the end of September 2023.

The **48th Annual Sappers Dinner** will be held at the Holiday Inn, Warwick Farm, on Saturday, 28 October 2023. The 4/3 Battalion RNSWR dance band will be providing background and dance music and, together with various awards, prizes and a sumptuous buffet dinner, this event promises to be a memorable occasion for all Sappers and their guests. The attached dinner flyer provides the relevant information. It is imperative that the RSVP date be adhered to, so we can confirm numbers and avoid any future financial penalty for the Association. Should you be planning to book overnight accommodation at the venue, please follow the booking instructions at the foot of the flyer.

In our June 2022 Newsletter, I referred to a donation made to the Association by a former Committee member, John Ray, in memory of his late wife, Faye. You were also advised that the 1st Field Squadron Group RAE Association (FSG Assn) was seeking funding for a memorial **Bailey Bridge to be erected in Amiens, France**, in recognition of the courageous service of Sappers on the Western Front during World War One. Following investigation of the Bailey Bridge project, your Committee has recently become aware that the FSG Assn is a registered charity in the Queensland jurisdiction (Charitable Organisation No. CP6457), thereby allowing the donation to proceed.

You may be aware that John Pritchard has, for a number of years, facilitated "Sappers Quarterly Lunches" in the City (Sydney), usually at a pub or club. These lunches have proved to be a very successful way for Sappers to share short and tall stories during a meal, as well as discussing topical issues that affect the RAE Corps and Army. The Committee is keen to facilitate this kind of comradeship amongst members who reside outside the Sydney metropolitan area. Would any member who resides in the Newcastle, Illawarra, Canberra or other regional area and is prepared to host or attend such quarterly get-togethers in their local area, please advise the Secretary so we can put locals in touch with each other. The lunches (or morning teas, or afternoon teas or dinners) could be held on the same days as the "Sappers Quarterly Lunches", to provide a sense of common bonding of members in various parts of the State.

Your Committee is currently investigating our possible involvement with **Remembrance Day** commemorations at the Sydney War Memorial, Hyde Park South. Sadly, we have lost two of our members/former members since the issuing of our June Newsletter:

Willian Francis 'Johno' Johnson died of a heart attack on 1 Sep 23. 'Johno' served in RAE in the CMF before he did National Service in Artillery, where he served in Vietnam, then returned to RAE CMF/ARES. He is a former member of our Association and well known in the RAE Reserve world. He served in 4 FD SQN, 5 FD SQN, 4 FER, 103 CONST SQN, 26 DIV ENG SPT SQN and 5 CER

David Edward 'Joe' Coleman died on 4 May 2023 David was on our Sick Parade list in the in our March 2023 Newsletter, where we reported that his wife had advised that he had had a setback with his melanoma. He did his National Service in 23 CONST SQN and 18 FD SQN and later joined the Ares and served in the Transport Corps, but always considered himself a Sapper.

Brian Houlahan = has told us that he is pleased to say that he is not suffering much in the way of side effects (yet). He is in the second week of four treatment cycles, following which he will have a bone marrow transplant, after some heavy doses of Chemo. After that he will have a break of between 60-100 days before the final two cycles of chemo. He feels like a bit of a pin cushion with 5-6 blood tests, 4-6 injections and one infusion each month.

News Updates

2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM)

The AGM is scheduled for Saturday, 14 October 2023, commencing at 1400 hours (2:00pm).

The AGM will be conducted as a teleconference, where you can use your landline or mobile phone to "phone in" and join the audio (not video) meeting.

Please note that you will have to practice your Army radio/telephone voice procedures, in order to maintain a level of radio discipline over the airwaves (sometimes a challenge for Sappers). Details of the AGM will be emailed to you with the AGM Notice, in late September 2023.

CHANGES FLOWING FROM THE PASSING OF HER MAJESTY

In our September 2022 Newsletter there was discussion of the changes that are likely to occur following the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. These included:

- ·The appointment of a Colonel-in-Chief of the Royal Australian Engineers;
- ·Changes to the RAE cap badge with the change from EIIR to CIIIR and the change of the crown;
- · Possible change of the crown on the RAE cipher; and
- · Changes to the crown that are, or are part of, the designation of rank of some non-commissioned and commissioned officers.

RAE Head of Corps staff have advised that these are all still 'work-in-progress', with our corps working with other Australian and Commonwealth corps and appropriate officials.

Meanwhile, the Royal Engineers have:

- · A new Colonel-in-Chief, King Charles III; and
- \cdot A new cap badge, which as you can see below includes the King's cypher, which is the crown and CRIII.

There are no images of the new Royal Engineers cypher but, again, it is reasonable to assume it and ultimately ours will have the same crown as the King's Cypher and similarly the badges of rank, which include a crown, will change to that crown.

As we reported in the September 2021 edition of our newsletter:

Curtis McGrath joined the Australian Army in 2006 and on 23 August 2012, as a Combat Engineer with the 6th Engineer Support Regiment, he was badly injured by an Improvised Explosive Device during operations in Urozgan Province, Afghanistan. The explosion resulted in him losing his left leg below the knee and his right leg at the knee. He suffered shattered bones in his wrist, burnt left arm, perforated ear drums and large wound at the back of his thigh. He was originally taken to an American medical base in Germany and then to Royal Brisbane Hospital for rehabilitation. Within three months, he was walking on prosthetic legs.

Prior to his military injury, Curtis was a keen white-water canoeist, rugby player and swimmer. He took up canoeing and swimming as part of his rehabilitation. In devoting his energy to sport, Curtis commented: "In sport, you are getting your body to do things you don't do every day. It helps your body to adjust more easily to everyday things."

An inspirational young man that we are proud to say is a Sapper.

New Foreign Award from the Vietnam War

NEW APPROVED FOREIGN AWARD - REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM CROSS OF GALLANTRY WITH PALM UNIT CITATION (RVCGWPUC)

The Hon Matt Keogh MP, the Minister for Defence Personnel, announced that the Department of Defence has recently completed the necessary research required to identify the relevant units, and consequently individuals, who are eligible to apply for and receive the RVCGWPUC, may do so.

All ADF personnel who served in the war of South Vietnam are eligible to wear the Republic of Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm Unit Citation. However, you must check the information sheets which contain the units that are eligible and the dates that those units are approved to apply, e.g. Small Ships have a listing of dates that are not the same as other RAE units. See an extract of the information sheet below.

Families/NOK of those who died post-Vietnam will also be eligible to apply for this device on behalf of their deceased loved ones.
