If the last American Civil War pension was paid in May 2020 to a dependant (daughter) of a serving CSA soldier; the last widow of a serving CSA soldier in 2008; and the last widow of a serving Union soldier in 2003, how long will the pensions for our current returned servicemen and women go for? Has anyone done the maths on this? I gave up when the wires on my abacus broke.

He's been at it again; it seems Derek Smith just can't stop digging holes for wells. "Located at Kon Ron Village, Kon Tum Province, Vietnam the village is about 17 km from Kon Tum. Most of the people, particularly children, had not seen people looking like us with my son Michael (pictured on far right) being 6ft 5in and me (pictured on far left) being 6ft 1in, both with fair hair. We were something of a novelty and kids were not too keen to get too close.

Anyway, they drilled down 110 metres and found a good supply of water which is pumped up using an electric motor to a 2000 litre above ground tank. It is then filtered using reverse osmosis and out to taps so all the villagers have easy access. End result is that clean, filtered water is

provided for about 2500 villagers. We are hearing that health of kids and elderly has improved, probably as a result of having clean, filtered water. We tried to get some statistics on numbers of folks presenting to doctors/hospital, but that was a bit of a mission. Still all the indicators are good. This was our 8th well. Villagers are keen to show their appreciation for such work. They have nothing to give of course. They are as poor as church mice. However they will share their 'jar wine'. The images attached speak for themselves.

I would like to sincerely thank our Association for their support with this project."

10 May next year will see the Third Combat Engineer Regiment exercising their Right of Freedom of Entry to the City of Bowen. They were bestowed this honour for the sterling work they did at Airlie Beach in the aftermath of cyclonic floods. Hands were re-acquainted with the feel of shovels and crow bars; although for some it would appear that it


